The grade for the course will be based on a paper (around 4000 words, to be submitted by **November 30<sup>th</sup>**) and a forty minutes written examination scheduled for **December 15<sup>th</sup> and January 12<sup>th</sup>** at 10 am. The written examination will consist of thirty-one multiple-choice questions. Students have to enrol for the exam of their choice in advance through the University website.
